## LCAM 2006 Award Report

What an amazing adventure! Spending a long weekend with nearly 600 highly motivated, intelligent, community conscience, self sacrificing, giving and loving women- all with the same goals can be very rewarding and energizing.

My first day began with the Learning Module 1, "Professional and Volunteer Leadership: Thinking Like a Genius" with guest speaker Anna Liotta. In this module we learned what makes a great leader, how to recognize a great leader, and how to be a great leader. We discussed "thinking like a genius" and "thinking outside of the box", enhancing our creative thinking, and initiating changes based on that thinking. We then discussed EWI and the key areas of chapter success. These areas are: Recruitment, Participation, Retention, Attract, Optimize, and Retain. We then broke into groups where we brainstormed and discussed different ideas, what has worked for us and what has not worked. I came away with many new ideas. Thus ended my first learning module, where I came away with so much information to process.

The evening brought us the Welcome Reception. It began with a 'meet and greet' in the convention center lobby. Chapters dressed in matching attire arrived with pins, buttons, and stickers. Thus began a mad frenzy of collecting these items, that resembled adult trick-or-treating, and culminated in not knowing where one's body began and the buttons ended. It felt a little awkward and uncomfortable at first; but then I saw "It", a Hank Williams button from the Montgomery, Alabama chapter. With my husband an official member of the Hank Williams Fan Club, I was not going home without one! The search was on, and my frenzy had begun! Finally, just before going in for dinner, I found 'It'. Mission accomplished, the button on my shirt, I thought "It can't get any better than this". Then it did. The evening closed with a wonderful dinner, Disney characters, group photos, dancing and fireworks.

The next day brought us an eye opening breakfast with guest speaker Colleen Barrett of Southwest Airlines, then a Plenary Session on Organizational Creativity Disney-Style and how we can utilize it in our own businesses. This was later followed by an inspiring luncheon with guest speaker Byrd Baggett, whose wit, wisdom, and compassion, made him an LCAM favorite. He left us with words of hope, encouragement, vision, purpose, and little "nuggets of inspiration" that we will remember for the rest of our lives.

Lunch was followed by two learning sessions from the Disney Institute: Management Disney-Style, and Quality Service Disney-Style. The evening ended with the Spirit of Aloha Luau at the Disney Polynesian Resort where we were presented with a scrumptious dinner, and entertained with a stage show featuring dances originating from the different islands of Hawaii. We then headed back to our hotel, where we opened our rooms to a hospitality evening of wine, snacks, good conversation, and lots of laughter with many members from other chapters. The third day arrived and the battle began with the Open Forum, and Delegate Session.
